




The State of California Releases Their Findings, Recommendations and Action Items that can

be Taken NOW to Address Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia

The West Coast Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia Science Panel (<u>The Panel</u>) works in partnership with the California Ocean Science Trust at the request of the California Ocean Protection Council. The Panel has concluded that global carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions are triggering changes to ocean chemistry along the US West Coast that require immediate, decisive action to combat, including development of a coordinated regional management strategy.

The Panel's report titled, "Major Findings, Recommendations and Actions," summarizes the state of the science around Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia (OAH) and outlines a series of potential management actions that California, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia governments can immediately implement to offset and mitigate the economic and ecological impacts.

Los Angeles Sanitation 2015 Hyperion Diversion Post-Monitoring Fact Sheet Now on the SCCOOS Website

The City of Los Angeles diverted the Hyperion Water Reclamation Plant's effluent from its 5-Mile Outfall to its auxiliary 1-Mile Outfall, with an average flow volume of 250 million gallons per day (mgd) from September 21 to November 2, 2015, to allow for critical repairs to infrastructure.

They recently released their post-monitoring fact sheet and you can find it on the SCCOOS <u>Webpage</u>. This report highlights the results and conclusions of Hyperion's diversion monitoring plan which includes the SCCOOS component of data sharing and public communications.


